Collaborative research and partnership working

This year's conference revisits the important theme of 'collaboration' in the pursuit of research which is created and undertaken within multiple partnerships.

Such partnerships may be with academics, with other disciplines, with clinicians or with service users – or increasingly with all of these and more! Achieving effective and equitable relationships requires all parties to be clear about values, purpose and boundaries of the collaborative work. Negotiating the principles of this collaboration above the self-interests of individuals, teams and organisations, is a constant challenge across the divides of language, geography and culture. We welcome examples of successful partnerships and their resulting outcomes but also those which illustrate the range of 'dilemmas' and 'challenges' for a contemporary appraisal of collaboration in mental health research.

Concurrent sessions

A workshop is presented by an expert within the field and may be pitched at a novice, intermediate or advanced level. Please indicate the level in your submission. To be considered for a workshop you must submit an abstract (1000 words limit), detailing the focus of the workshop and the nature of participation.

Poster presentations form a significant part of the conference proceedings and presenters will have an excellent opportunity to interact with delegates. Posters should be highly visually stimulating and legibly presented.

- Responses to conflict and trauma
- Culture, ethnicity and mental health

Key speaker details

Improving access to psychological therapies: Helping over a million people climb out of the slough of despond

Professor David Richards, Mental Health Services Research, School of Psychology, University of Exeter, UK

David Richards is a provocative speaker with challenging viewpoints well worth considering. At the forefront of national and international efforts to improve access to treatment for those suffering from high prevalence mental health problems such as depression, his work involves developing and testing evidence based treatments, and then translating alternative models of treatment delivery into routine clinical environments. David led the development of the low-intensity treatment methods at the heart of the UK Department of Health's 'Improving Access to Psychological Therapies' (IAPT) programme from its inception in 2005 and continues to act as Clinical Informatics Advisor to the IAPT programme. David is also Secretary of the European Academy of Nursing Science and is committed to providing European doctoral summer school education programmes for researchers in nursing.

Translating collaborative mental health research

Dr Vanessa Pinfold, Deputy Director of Knowledge and Learning, Rethink, UK

Vanessa Pinfold is responsible for research. Innovation. Information and advice at Rethink, the leading UK mental health membership charity. For her, collaborative research is in her DNA. Vanessa is involved in research partnerships investigating mental health stigma and discrimination, carer experiences of mental health services, service user and carer involvement in research and research into complex interventions. She is at the forefront in translating research into practice development initiatives, is a consultant to the Mental Health Research Network on public and patient involvement issues, a member of INVOLVE and holds an honorary lecture post at the Institute of Psychiatry.

Methodological plenary: Mixed methods research

Professor John Creswell, University of Nebraska, USA

John Creswell is Professor of Educational Psychology at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and is probably the leading authority writing on qualitative methodology and mixed methods research. He has authored 10 books, many of which focus on research design, qualitative research, and mixed methods research. This has included reviewing the core characteristics and essential elements of mixed methods research in the social and human sciences and relating these to trauma research. John is also the founding co-editor for the new Sage journal, Journal of Mixed Methods Research.

My PhD: Attitudes impacting on practice - transitions in the life of a clinical researcher

Dr Sara Munro, Nurse Consultant, Acute Care, Cumbria Partnership NHS Foundation Trust, UK

From working on acute psychiatric inpatient wards, Sarah Munro came up with an idea that won her a scholarship to conduct research for a PhD exploring attitudes amongst acute mental health nurses and service users across 10 different trusts, using both quantitative and qualitative methods. Sarah recently returned to clinical practice as a consultant nurse and maintains links with academia, supporting research in her Trust. In this fascinating session, Sarah explores the transitions on her journey from practice to research and back again, outlining the personal and professional opportunities and developments that have resulted.
