

Dear colleagues,

Workplace violence in the health sector is progressively gaining attention and recognition as being a global challenge. This occupational health hazard affects more than one or two single professions, and has become a major concern for many different stakeholders in the health care sector. Governments, management, professionals, health care workers, insurance companies, service users/clients, educators, trainers, researchers, the police, professional and trade union organizations see the serious impact of workplace violence. Together, we can create a safer work environment and support excellence in care.

There is great need to raise awareness of this occupational health hazard and to look for the right evidence based answers and strategies that will reduce and mitigate the effects of violence. The ultimate goal is an environment in which health, safety and personal well-being is being ensured for all individuals and groups within the health care sector. Workers and clients have the right to expect a safe environment that supports the delivery of effective care and quality client services. It is time for an international conference where all stakeholders can reach consensus and endeavour to create a safe work environment.

- To understand the manifestations and the human, professional and economic implications of workplace violence.
- To promote effective policies and strategies to create safe work environments
