# **10<sup>TH</sup> EUROPEAN CONGRESS** ON VIOLENCE IN CLINICAL PSYCHIATRY

"Creating collaborative care: a multi-partnership approach"

On behalf of the scientific committee we would like to invite psychiatric clinicians, psychiatrists, practitioners, psychiatric mental health nurses, psychologists, health scientists, educators, trainers, researchers, managers, and policymakers engaged in the management, research, study or clinical treatment of aggressive and violent behaviour of psychiatric patients and persons with intellectual disabilities and serious behavioural problems to attend the 10<sup>th</sup> European Congress on Violence in Clinical Psychiatry.

**The first congress** was held in 1992 in Stockholm – Sweden, as an initiative by Prof. Börje Wistedt, the head of one of the larger psychiatric clinics in Stockholm at Danderyd Hospital / Karolinska Institutet. He and his staff organized the congress with him as chairman and Tom Palmstierna as his scientific secretary. It was held in the center of Stockholm at the Swedish Medical Association. The congress was attended by around 120 delegates, held lectures and seminars but no parallel sessions.

**For several reasons, the second congress** was not held until 2001. By that time the European Violence in Psychiatry Research Group (EViPRG) was founded in 1997 and it was suggested to go on with more congresses in the name of this group in order to propagate the science in the field to clinicians, researchers and managers. The congress was co-organized by the Addiction Center and Prof. Stefan Borg who was the head of this clinic. It was held in the center of Stockholm, and there were around 200 delegates.

**The third congress** was in London in summer 2003. This congress was organized by Tom Palmstierna and Gerd Nyman and supported by the Addiction Center and Prof. Stefan Borg, and around 185 delegates did attend.

**From 2005 on the congresses** are logistically organized by Oud Consultancy & Conference Management, chaired by Henk Nijman & Tom Palmstierna and organized in close collaboration with the EVIPRG. Since 2011 it is also a World Psychiatric Association (WPA) co-sponsored meeting, and by 2015 also in collaboration with the European Network for Training in the Management of Aggression (ENTMA<sup>08</sup>).



This time the congress will be held in Dublin – Ireland from the 26<sup>th</sup> till the 28<sup>th</sup> of October 2017. Since the first European Congress on Violence in Clinical Psychiatry the congress has expanded rapidly with regard to the number of scientific contributions and participants. The last 2015 congress in Copenhagen for example was attended by  $\pm$  600 participants from 36 countries world-wide.

As was the case for the previous congresses held in Vienna (2005), Amsterdam (2007), Stockholm (2009), Prague (2011), Ghent (2013) and Copenhagen (2015) also all contributions to the 10<sup>th</sup> European Congress on Violence in Clinical Psychiatry will be collected in a publication "book of proceedings" reflecting the current state of knowledge about, and research on the prevention and treatment of aggressive and violent behaviour of psychiatric patients & persons with intellectual disability, and the training and education of interdisciplinary staff.

The 10<sup>th</sup> European Congress on Violence in Clinical Psychiatry is co-organized by the European Violence in Psychiatry Research Group (EViPRG) & the European Network for Training in the Management of Aggression (ENTMA<sup>08</sup>), and with due reserve is a World Psychiatric Association (WPA) co-sponsored meeting.

**The 10<sup>th</sup> European Congress on Violence** will focus strongly on clinically relevant and practically useful interdisciplinary scientific and practical knowledge with regard to interventions aiming at treating and reducing violent behaviour of psychiatric patients, forensic patients and severe problem behaviour in persons with intellectually disability. Hence the overall congress theme "Creating collaborative care: a multi-partnership approach".

**Accredited** for a maximum of 18 Continuing Medical Educational credits by the World Psychiatric Association (WPA), and approval of accreditation is requested from the International Council of Nurses (ICN) for the award of International Continuing Nursing Education Credits (ICNECs).

### The broad multi- and interdisciplinary scope of the European Congress on Violence in Clinical Psychiatry is expressed in the various subthemes that will be addressed in Dublin in 2017:

- 7. Neurobiological approaches and pharmacological therapies
- 8. Psychological approaches & interventions
- 9. Service users & family perspectives
- 10. Race, gender, cross-cultural & ethnicity perspectives
- **11.** Ethical, human rights and legal perspectives
- 12. Sexual offending violence
- **13.** Specific populations: forensics
- 14. Specific populations: intellectually disabled / learning disabilities
- **15.** Specific populations: child & adolescent
- 16. Specific populations: elderly / dementia
- **17.** Specific populations: refugees & displaced people
- 18. Training and education of (interdisciplinary) staff
- Application of new technology (media social networks information technology – e-learning – virtual environment)
- 20. ENTMA presentations / contributions
- 21. Other related themes
